
Arterial Bus Rapid Transit in the Twin Cities

A network of eight arterial BRT lines by 2030

- A Line (Snelling): 2016
- C Line (Penn): 2019
- D Line (Chicago/Fremont): 2022
- B Line (Lake/Marshall/Selby): 2024
- E Line (Hennepin/France): 2025
- F Line (Central Avenue): 2026, pending full funding
- G Line (Rice/Robert): 2027, pending full funding
- H Line (Como/Maryland): 2028, pending full funding



Designed to be faster, more reliable, and easy to use

2-3 stations per mile, designed for faster stops

High-tech, highamenity, secure stations

Pre-boarding fare payment for faster stops

Higher-capacity buses & boarding through all doors

Bus priority signals & lanes


Faster, frequent, all-day service





METRO A Line: Twin Cities' first Arterial BRT Line

- First in a planned program of 11 lines
- 10 miles long
- 20 stations
- 4 cities and 2 counties
- \$27 million project cost (2016)
- Proven transit corridor with frequent service and 4,000 daily rides pre-A Line
- >30% ridership increase in first year




Connecting with stakeholders and building excitement

- Prior to 2016, Arterial BRT was a new concept in the Twin Cities
- Cross-functional internal working group over two years prior to launch to define key features
- Community group info sessions and open houses
- Met with riders and businesses, used onepagers dedicated to specific audiences
- "Office hours" at organizations and businesses along the corridor
- Joined community events to help spread the word





How is the street space organized?



Arterial BRT better for all users of street space



A Line and C Line: Early BRT Success

- Opened 2016 (A Line) and 2019 (C Line); >30% Ridership growth/corridor
- Over 3 million BRT rides 2019, 2.4 million 2020
- BRT has retained more ridership throughout the pandemic than any other type of transit service













2019: C Line open for service 2021: Partnership with City of Minneapolis to add bus lanes




December 2022: D Line brings BRT to Minnesota's highest ridership bus route




Lake Street & Lagoon Avenue

2025: E Line opens after multi-year construction coordinated with 12+ street projects




