


EAST DENVER NEIGHBORHOODS/EAST COLFAX **SELF-GUIDED WALKING TOUR**






Walk northeast on Court Place and cross east on East 17th Avenue. Bike lanes are along East 16th Avenue.













Colfax Avenue is the longest commercial street in the U.S. Once a bustling trolley route in The Mile High City in the 1890s, today, the street is lined with an eclectic mix of eateries, bars, brewpubs and shops, as well as entertainment and live music venues.

(A) Wells Fargo Center

Wells Fargo Center is a 52-story Class A office tower commanding an iconic presence on the Denver skyline. The tower is known for its distinctive double-curved crown, and its red granite and glass façade. This design resembles a cash register and is known locally as the "Cash Register Building".

D Bar

(C) Retrograde/Frozen Matter



Clever cocktails served in a petite, stylish lounge hidden in back of Frozen Matter ice cream shop.

(D) Ace Eat Serve



High-energy hot spot in an old garage for Pan-Asian chow, cocktails & table tennis, plus juice bar.

E) The Denver Bicycle Cafe



Bike repair from an on-site mechanic plus craft beers, gourmet roasted coffee & daily happy hour.

St. Mark's Coffee House



Humble baked-goods & coffee purveyor with garage-door windows that open to a patio in warm weather.

G Vine Street Pub & Brewery



Mellow hangout provides house-brewed beers, American eats with veggie options & outdoor seating. Does not accept credit cards.

(H) Denver City Park

City Park is 330 acres and is located in east-central Denver. The park contains the Denver Zoo, the Denver Museum of Nature and Science, Ferril and Duck Lakes, and a boathouse.

East High School

East High School is a public high school located in the City Park neighborhood on the east side of Denver, Colorado. Opened in 1875 and was the first high school in Denver.

J) Hooked on Colfax

(K) Bluebird Theater

The Bluebird Theater in Denver, Colorado was designed by Harry W.J. Edbrooke and built during 1913–1914 as Thompson Theater. It was renamed to Blue Bird Theater or Bluebird Theater in 1922. It is currently used as a live music venue.


