

CITIZENS' INDEPENDENT TRANSPORTATION TRUST



MOVING FORWARD

The Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) is the 15-member volunteer body that was created to oversee how Miami-Dade County's half-cent Surtax funds are invested in transportation projects. Trust members review and make decisions on contracts requesting the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) funding, monitor the progress of surtax funded road and transit projects, and oversee the management of the PTP Municipal Transportation Program,

The Surtax generates more than \$300 million annually and has been used for a broad range of projects, including the Orange Line Metrorail extension to Miami International Airport, new Metromover and Metrorail vehicles, new eco-friendly buses, upgraded traffic signals, the construction of rapid transit corridors, and a variety of municipal projects.


